By-law description: This by-law establishes a policy for the delivery of municipal services in both official languages in the City of Greater Sudbury.

Report Item

Greater Sudbury enjoys the third largest Francophone population in Canada outside of Quebec. Approximately 50,000 residents list French as their mother tongue.

BY-LAWS (Continued)

A number of Area Municipalities have historically provided services in both official languages in their respective communities, including the Region of Sudbury, the City of Sudbury, the City of Valley East and the Town of Rayside-Balfour.

The former Regional Council, through resolution, unanimously endorsed an enhanced and expanded level of French-language services for the new City, as did the Transition Board.

Attached is a proposed policy on the delivery of municipal services in both official languages in the City of Greater Sudbury. The policy recognizes the importance of providing French-language services in response to community needs. The policy includes proposed operational guidelines for implementation.

Rapport

Le Grand Sudbury possède la troisième population francophone en importance au Canada hors Québec. Environ 50 000 résidents disent que le français est leur langue maternelle.

Par le passé, certaines municipalités locales ont livré des services municipaux dans les deux langues officielles dans leur communauté respective, notamment la Région de Sudbury, la Ville de Sudbury, la Ville de Valley East et la Ville de Rayside-Balfour.

Par le biais d'une résolution, l'ancien Conseil régional et ensuite le Conseil de transition ont appuyé à l'unanimité l'amélioration et l'accroissement des services en français dans la nouvelle ville.

Une politique proposée sur la livraison de services municipaux dans les deux langues officielles dans la Ville du Grand Sudbury se trouve en annexe. La politique reconnaît l'importance de la livraison des services en français en vue de répondre aux besoins de la communauté. La politique comprend également des lignes directrices opérationnelles proposées.
