## Public Awareness



Speed Watch is an initiative of the City of Greater Sudbury and the Greater Sudbury Police Service to reduce speeding on area roads through public awareness and community action.



Speeding in residential neighbourhoods is one of the most frequent concerns expressed to City staff and elected officials. Each year, the City receives many inquiries about installing stop signs as a way to reduce speeding but research shows that other measures can be more effective.

Speed Watch is designed to make motorists aware of their driving habits and the negative impact excessive speed can have on the peace and safety of residential neighbourhoods.



## Community Action



A portable Radar Unit is available for loan to citizens of the City of Greater Sudbury. Volunteers monitor traffic speed in their neighbourhood using the Radar Unit. There is no charge to borrow the equipment and training is provided by the City of Greater Sudbury.

Volunteers record vehicle speed and licence plate numbers. This information is submitted to the Traffic and Transportation section of the City of Greater Sudbury for verification. If excessive traffic speed is found to be a problem, the submission is forwarded to the Greater Sudbury Police Service.

The Greater Sudbury Police Service may issue cautionary letters to registered owners of vehicles identified as exceeding the speed limit. Tickets are not issued under the Speed Watch program but chronic speeding in the neighbourhood could result in a "zero tolerance" speed enforcement campaign.
