Councillor Bradley advised he had received numerous complaints regarding the noise created by front end loaders banging their scoops in order to remove snow from the equipment.

He further requested that the General Manager of Public Works investigate the use of O'Connor Park as a snow dump site.

Infrastructure Funding

Mayor Gordon advised he had attempted to meet with the Federal Members of Parliament regarding the status of the infrastructure funding for the south end rock tunnel project. No response has been received to date. Mayor Gordon indicated he would keep Council informed of any progress.
